

Shelter From the Storm Asilomar Accords

Created in 2004 by animal welfare leaders from around the country, the Asilomar Accords provide a statistical framework, and a set of guiding principles, aimed at reducing the euthanasia of healthy and treatable dogs and cats. By providing a means to track animal health and euthanasia rates, and to compare those statistics to other participant organizations, the Asilomar system will let us measure our progress in reducing euthanasia and increasing the number of animals we save.

COMMENTS:Animals were transferred in from Adams county, Anderson animal Shelter, Anti-cruelty, ARF's German Shepard Rescue, CCHS, Chattooga County Animal Shelter, Coulee Region Humane society, Countyside HS, Dodge County HS, ECA, FDLHS, Fort Waye Department of Animal care and Control, Geargia state rescues, Great Pyrenees Rescue, Illinois Shelter, Iowa County HS,Kenosha HS, Mayfeild/Graves Co AS, MADACC, People for Petsm Randolph County HS, SPCR, VES, Wis Chihuahua Rescue. 8 of the dogs euthanized were doen so because of behavior and 1 was euthanized for medical reasons. 8 dogs died in the rescue, this was a litter of new born puppies, they died to unknown causes. 20 cats were euthanized, all but 2 were suthanized to untreatable medical conditions. the other two were euthanized because of beahvior reasons. 38 cats/kittens died in our care, all were from medical causes and were kittens being bottle fed except 1 cat that was an adult - she was found dead in her kennel - necropsy showed a heartcondition.
